#### League matches

We will be breaking new ground this season with four teams: *two* Intermediate Teams, a Federation Team and a Parkstone Qualifier Team.

Because we have so many members now able and keen to play at intermediate level, we have entered one team into the North Region (Broadwas, Worcester, Swindon, and Dyffryn, managed by Brian), and one team in the Central Region (Bath, Taunton, Wellington and Nailsea, managed by Paul). Shortly, we need to organise two pools of players — one for each region because you are not allowed to play in both.

We are unable to enter the B League this year because we do not have enough high handicap members at present but Don has organised something special for them (see below).

The Federation Team will be playing Cheltenham, Kington Langley, Nailsea, Swindon and Dyffryn. The Parkstone Team will be playing Nailsea, Budleigh Salterton, Sidmouth, Cheltenham and Bristol.

Rosemary is currently arranging fixture dates and hopes to have them ready in time for the February Newsletter. As soon as dates have been arranged, league managers will be asking you to confirm which dates you will be available to play. 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## 4. Help! What do I do now?

This article is printed on its own page in case you want to cut it out and keep it.

The following are questions asked of me recently.

I have just run hoop 2 and my ball has ended up a few inches short of the boundary line. Do I bring it back to the yard line?

NO. The next shot is played from where it lies. You only bring your ball onto the yard line if it actually goes off

Note. This is also the case with your ball after a croquet stroke. The croqueted ball, however, IS replaced immediately.

My opponent is about to run his hoop from a short distance. He uses his foot as a guide and slides his mallet head along his shoe. Is this allowed?

NO. It used to be but the laws changed in 2008 making this move illegal. Law 28 a (1) stipulates this as a fault and you should forestall further play and ask your opponent either to leave the balls where they lie or replace them in the position they were in before the offending stroke was played. This is YOUR choice, not his. It is then the end of his turn.

Should you forestall BEFORE the stroke if you can clearly see what is going to happen? The laws are not entirely clear and the advice of the CA laws committee is being sought. Its response will be published in the next newsletter.
